Erik Heimstaedt, Jeremy Jenkins, Blake Davis, Keeley McWilliams & Edgar Apodaca take South Side Pier Event

South Side Pier, Huntington Beach, California

CONTEST NOTES: What a way to end the open contest, good weather, good waves and great competition. The Invitational is always the crown on top of the Summer Series, as it's a day to do your best, surf south side, and have a lot of fun too!

BOY'S DIVISION: They were out to do well and they did! It was all up to the competitors Scoring big on their waves. **Blake Davis** took first place with 42.5 points, having a perfect day finishing first in all of his heats, as well as taking fourth for the year. **Jachin Hamborg** took second with 33.5 points scoring a few 6's in the heat, as he was looking for the sweep as he took first for the season. Third place was earned by **Luke Barrett** who had 32 points, while **Matt Porteous** who had a great first season with us took fourth place scoring 31.5. **Jordan Desquin** had 23.5 points and a fifth place finish as **Jake VanHerk** finished in sixth place scoring 22 points.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Craig Barrett** and **Aryn Farris** as equal ninths went to **Tyler Baker** and **Jayson Payne** (who finished in second for the season).

JUNIOR'S DIVISION: It was another great group of contestants, surfing in a close final heat. Helping top a great year and taking first place with some excellent rides was **Jeremy Jenkins** scoring 37 points. Jeremy was also perfect for the day scoring first place in all of his heats, as well as taking second overall. Second place went to **Matt Payne** who scored 34 points. Then **Zach Porteous** who was just behind with 32 points and taking third place. Scoring 30 points and coming in fourth was **Cole Devine**, who had a great year finishing first overall. Fifth place with 27 points was **Matt Porteous** who along with his brothers had a great season with the CCSA (Matt taking 3rd in both Boy's and Jrs., as Zach took fifth in Jrs. and brother Tyler took sixths in the boy's). Taking sixth place with 26 points was **Charlie Hawthorne**, who had an up and down day taking first in the semifinals.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Luke Barrett** and **Cheyne Shoffner**, who was one of our top six finishers for the year. Equal ninths went to **Jake Farnell** and **Erik Heimstaedt**

who finish in fourth overall for the season.

MEN'S DIVISION: It was a final that was set to put on a good show, with all of the finalist getting at least a first in one of their heats leading into the final. But in the end scoring big was **Erik Hiemstaedt** who scored 40.5 scoring 7's on a few waves. Scoring 37 and second was **Keetin Devine** he had finished first for the season too. Third went to **Troy Bertrand** with 30 points, as he had taken first place in the semifinals. **Matt Payne** tied with **David O'Toole** each scoring 29 points, and on the count back Matt edged out David by a point 17 to 16. (As Matt took fourth place while David came in fifth.) Then scoring 21 points was **Richard Payne** earning 6th as he had a good day too, having placed first in the Quarters and second in the semifinals.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Cody Bertrand** and **Zach Porteous**, as equal ninths went to **Shawn Farnell** and **Anthony Feolo**, who came in fifth place for the season.

WOMEN'S DIVISION: As the final contest of the season finishes we saw a decline in contestants, but an increase in close competition. Taking first in the Invitational with 31.5 points was **Keeley McWilliams**, who finished sixth in the overall. Taking second place with 29 points was **Brooke Daigneault**, who was third for the season. **Wendy Black** came in third with 23.5, as she also finished fourth this season. Scoring 21 points was **Sheila Huber** which gave her fourth as she finished second overall. The favorite coming into the contest was our overall leader for the season **Krystle Melton** she scored 19, but was just missing a few good rides in the final. Taking sixth place with 17 points, was **Heather Apodaca** who had a great time surfing.

LONG BOARD DIVISION: Making a slow and steady ascent and taking the Invitational was our very own **Edgar Apodaca**. He scored 35 points on some very good rides, edging out the others by a close margin. **Robert Stirrat** was just a point and a half back with 33.5, he had been making his move up the ratings finishing 13th. Third place went to **Ken Gordon** scoring 28 points who had finished first in the semifinals. Fourth place with 25 points went to **Tony Bartovich** who took first in the quarters, and second in the semis. Surfing to fifth place was **Anthony Feolo** who scored 24 points, who was the only top six overall to make the finals. Scoring 22.5 points was **Michael Barret** who was in tenth for the season.

Other results: Coming in equal sevenths were **Troy Bertrand** (who finished second in the overall) and **Terry Carmadella** (who finished in fifth for the season). While equal ninths went to **Garin Payne** and **Kevin Shepley**.

Gen. 2:15 The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.

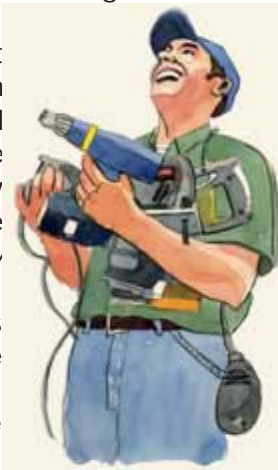
My wife hardly ever goes with me to a hardware store. She's afraid I'll embarrass her by my giddy behavior when I see all those new, amazing tools!

Actually, it's not quite that bad, but being in the store does make my head spin with the thoughts of projects I could do and what I'll need to do them. I try to discipline myself to go to places like Home Depot only when I really need to—otherwise I'll come home with a pile of stuff that *I just may need someday*.

How I approach hardware stores is a lot like the way many of us approach the gifts of the earth: It's just one big storehouse of vast natural resources for people to use.

Some lumber barons treated the great white pine forests of Michigan like that. When they were done, they had made enough boards to cover the entire state—all 96,000 square miles of it!

Sadly, they also destroyed much of the capacity they could have prevented the degradation



of soil that results from poor forestry practices. The lack of forest cover and the scar they left behind helped create several massive fires. The Great Thumb Fire of 1881 (as in the "thumb" of Michigan's mitten-like shape) raced through more than a million acres in less than a day, killing more than 200 people.

Whatever one thinks about the politics and philosophy of many environmentalists, the truth remains that people are the planet's stewards (Genesis 2: 15). Of all the species of living creatures on Earth, human beings are the only "responsible" species. We are the ones who have the power and intellectual capacity to manage the wonderful potential of God's creation gifts. And we can abuse those gifts by carelessness and selfish behavior. Then all creation suffers.
