9th Street Change Grants Good Surf for All! K. Devine, C. Devine, L. Barrett, R. Strirat & C. Landingham Take Firsts

9th Street, Huntington Beach, California

CONTEST NOTES: Great contest, but the dogs moved us down to 9th Street. The City changed our location and it seemed the waves were better for us than what we would have had. We again thank God for his devine wisdom.

BOY'S DIVISION: We had a great time as many more surfed this contest. The finals heat was extremely close as a half point separated first and second. Taking first place with 29.5 was **Luke Barrett**, with a few 6's and 5's. In second with 29 points was **Justin Davis** again (took second last contest). Taking third with 25.5 was **Sam Wickwire** who had a good day with seconds in his other heats (Sam also took third last contest). **Nolan Rapoza** took fourth with 24.5, he had a great move up from ninth. Fifth place with 24 points was **Blake Bowie** (also repeat from last contest) and taking home sixth with 23 points was **Kirk Weissinger**, who took first in his opening heat.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Hunter Barrett** and **Kyle Brown** while equal ninths went to **Matthew Fewel** and **Riley Peterson**.

JUNIOR'S DIVISION: This final was not like any other final we have had. Two of the contestants didn't show up. (We think they fell asleep somewhere - not sure.) Yet the ones who did surfed well, especially our top surfer - scoring 46.5 taking first was **Cole Devine**, who was perfect all day in his other heats. Taking second with 43.5 points was **Jeremy Jennings**, who had some good rides in the final. Third went to **Luke Barrett** who scored 35 points (and also took third last contest and first in boys this month too). **Tommy Shaw** who scored 24 struggled in the final, but came out and took fourth. **Blake Davis** and **Zach Porteous** both took equal fifths.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Jachin Hamborg** and **Schuyler Zimmerman** while equal ninths went to **Dakota Faircloth** and **Zach Patterson**.

MEN'S DIVISION: A smaller showing this month, but a good

group of contestants. Seeing his first contest this season and taking first in a close count back was **Keetin Devine**, scoring 34 points with a 12/15 count back. Close behind was **Matt Payne** with 34 points with a 12/13 count back. Taking third place not far from them with 32 points was **Richard Payne**, who had first and second in his other heats. Scoring 30 points and fourth place was **Chase Vittitoe** (also repeat from last month). Behind him with 27 points was **Troy Bertrand**, surfing well and taking fifth place, as **Jachin Hamborg** took sixth, scoring 26.5 points, who placed second and third in other heats.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Paul Kahler** and **Kaoru Murayama** while equal ninths went to **Bobby Hudson** and **Kyle Johnson**.

WOMEN'S DIVISION: A little more this contest - 5 now still not even a full heat (come on ladies, we need more to sign up). Taking first with 19 points was **Courtney Landingham** who started in our HS Winter team challenge a few years ago. Taking second with 14.5 was **Brooke Diagneault**, who is still first in overall. Third went to **Keeley McWilliams** did well, surfing in her first CCSA. **Krystle Melton**, who scored 5.5 and took fourth while **Kori Alpert**, also a new CCSA contestant took fifth.



LONG BOARD DIVISION: New faces from last month, but not to the CCSA. Scoring 38.5 and taking first place was **Robert Strirat**, who was solid all day long. Second and third tied, but on the count back **Dakota Faircloth** edged out **Scott Shannon** scoring 35 with a 21 count back as Scott scored 35 and 18. **Patrick Schlick** took third place with 32 and moved up from last months fifth. **Jiro Matsuzaki** had a good first contest scoring 29.5 and took fifth place. Very close back with 29 points was **Mike Stone** taking sixth place.
