# Competition Heats Up this Summer as A. Donahue, N. Boyd, R. Peterson, G. Rodriguez & B. Daigneault All Get Firsts!

**CONTEST NOTES:** Another great day with the forecast being average, we were blessed with above average waves and a great day of competition.

**BOY'S DIVISION:** We had a great final heat, that was set up by a great group of competitors in this close division. Taking first in the final with 30.5 was **Riley Petterson**, moving up from 7th to 4th. In second with 23.5 was **Luke Barrett** giving him the points to move him into first in the overall. Taking third with 23 points was **Matthew Hughes** making his move up to 10th place. In fourth place was **Jeremy Guilmette** with 22.5, moving him up to 7th place (standings on page 2 incorrect) with 265 points. Fifth place with 22 points was **Brendan Hiruma** grabbing a lot of good waves in his heat. **Jason Crane** scored 19 points and marked his first time in the finals.

**Other results:** Equal sevenths went to **Trevor Barton** and **Kirk Weissinger** (who is in 9th overall) while equal ninths went to **Davis Freud** and **Sam Wickwire** who remains in third overall.

**JUNIOR'S DIVISION:** This final was close top four within 2.5 points of each other. Scoring 28.5 and taking first was **Nicholas Boyd**, who moved up a spot to fifth in the overall. Taking second with 27 points was **Jachin Hamborg**, who took those points and moved into first place. Third place with 26.5 was **Shuyler Zimmerman** who moved into fourth. **Justin Davis** who scored 26 points came out in fourth. **Dakota Faircloth** scored 23 points and took fifth place as **Jeremy Jennings** took sixth with 20.5 and was knock down a spot to second overall.

**Other results:** Equal sevenths went to **Randy Harp** and **Taylor McDole** while equal ninths went to **Luke Barrett** (who moved up from tenth into third) and **Jeffery Cole**.

**MEN'S DIVISION:** No doubt the best heat of the season was in the first round as we saw barrels, power slides and you name it... The whole heat should have been able to advance and those who didn't know they were in the right place at the wrong time. Coming out on top of that heat with 41 points also took the final with 31 points **Andrew Donahue** (his first CCSA this season). Taking second with 30 points was **Pablo Fernandez** who moved into fifth overall. Scoring 26 and taking third place was **Shawn Thompson**, while close behind with 25.5 was **Mike Wiedemann**

taking fourth. Fifth place with 25 points was **Paul Kahler** who also moved into third in the overall. **Kaoru Murayama** took sixth scoring 20.5 points, who also moved into tenth in the overall.

**Other results:** Equal sevenths went to **Alex Dauw** and **Tyler Porteous** while equal ninths went to **Richard Payne** (who moved into first in the overall) and **Jason Ponteres**.

**WOMEN'S DIVISION:** A full heat and a few guest from out of state. Not that we don't get people from other states, it's just we have never had any from Tennessee before. Third went to **Joanna Stanley** who did extremely well, surfing in her first CCSA. **Krystle Melton**, who scored 10 points took fourth while our Tennesseans' **Nicole Millsaps**, took fifth with 3.5 points as **Mary Lynn Millsaps** took sixth place (first time surfing in a contest).

**LONG BOARD DIVISION:** A few more new faces this month too! Scoring 41 points taking first was **Gene Rodriguez**, who was solid with first and seconds all day long. Second with 33 points was **Cheyne McDole** also with first and seconds all day long. **Dakota Faircloth** (who took fifth in Juniors) scored 31 points taking third place and moved into fifth overall. **Edgar Apodaca** took fourth place with 27 points and had a fun day surfing. **Mike Stone** had a good day scoring 25.5 Taking fifth and moving up to 8th in the overall. Scoring 19 points was **Patrick Schlick** taking sixth place, and keeping him in second overall.

**Other results:** Equal sevenths went to **Pablo Fernandez** (fourth in the overall) and **Scott Shannon**, who remains in first in the overall while equal ninths went to **Terry Carmadella** and **Jiro Matsuzaki**.

## Your Faithful Friend

Junior high school can be one long intensive seminar on drama in relationships. I am convinced that any psychological malfunction in my life today is directly traceable to those two years of school. Okay, maybe it's not quite that dramatic, but junior high did teach me a little about fickle friendships.

I was minding my own business when one of Nancy's friends came up to me and announced, "Hey, did you know that Nancy likes you?" To be honest, I had never given Nancy a second thought until that moment, but suddenly I was intrigued. My male ego was suddenly stirred and I liked the idea of being liked! So I passed my message back through the string of friends that had conveyed the message to me. That is, of course, how junior high romance works. I told my friend, who told another friend, who told Nancy's friend, who then passed the message back to her. "Joe says that he likes you too!"

But by the time my message got back to Nancy, she no longer liked me! For the first time I was singled by the fickle flames of romance.

A lot of our friendships are like that, aren't they? We look back across the landscape of life and see different friends popping up here and there—our buddies from junior high, the girl we took to the prom in high school, the college roommates, the co-worker from the cubicle next to us. We realize quickly that many of those friendships, often consumingly important at the time, fade into dim memories leaving us thinking, "I wonder what happened to..."

Even more disconcerting is realizing how fickle we are in friendships. In honest moments, we could list the people we no longer get in touch with, or the phone calls we don't return. In life, solid, faithful-to-the-core friendships are few and far between.

"For great is your love, reaching to the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies." Psalm 57:10

I wonder if you and I bring that same dynamic into our relationship with Jesus? When we first meet Jesus, He is everything to us! But as time wears on, we tend to drift away. When was the last time He heard from you? When was the last time you sat down to hear His voice and fellowship with Him? As the old saying goes: "If God seems far away, guess who moved!" You may have gone on to other interests, but thankfully He hasn't lost interest in you. He, more than anyone else, remains there waiting for you as your faithful friend!

The psalmist often sings of God's undying love for us. And I need to tell you that it's not the kind of love that rides on emotions or favors. It is an expression of God's enduring, rock-solid commitment to you as His beloved, and it is often linked, as it is here in [Psalm 57:10](#), with His unfailing faithfulness. In fact, the psalmist literally cannot get his mind around the extensiveness of God's love and faithfulness, conceding finally that God's love "reaches to the heavens" and His faithfulness "reaches to the skies." In other words, it is without limit and without end.

So when you receive word that God loves you, please know that it is not a junior high school fickle, fleeting kind of love. It is a life-changing, eternally satisfying offer of a fulfilling friendship with your Creator. Today He stands knocking at your door wanting to come in and spend some quality time with you ([Revelation 3:20](#)). Go ahead, open the door of your heart—it's your faithful friend!
