Great Conditions help P. McMullin, W. Krautkramer, H. Barrett, S. Shannon & K. Melton all take First Place!

CONTEST NOTES: The last contest for the overall point standings before the invitational South Side of the HB Pier (If you have surfed at least one summer contest this year, you are invited to surf in the invitational) with the top six getting a prepaid entry. The surf was good with a NW swell coming in as the day went on - it was a great day!

BOY'S DIVISION: The top six in the boys remain in the top six with some rearranging of spots, all due to a great day of surfing. Going in to the finals two brothers meet again, and older usually beats younger but not this time. Scoring 24.5 was **Hunter Barrett taking first** and moving up from 6th to 4th. In second with 22 points was **Riley Petterson** moving him 4th to 2nd in the overall. Taking third place with 17.5 was **Luke Barrett** giving him the top spot in the overall. Fourth place was **Steven Duhoux** with 14 points surfing in his first CCSA. Fifth place with 9 points was **David Freud** doing good for his second contest with us. **Brooks Westervelt** took sixth and moved up to 12th in the overall points.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Brendan Hiruma** and **Sam Wickwire** (who remained in 3rd overall) while equal ninths went to **Jason Crane** and **Will Laidlaw** who also surfed in his first CCSA.

JUNIOR'S DIVISION: A lot of movement here as some in double digits get into top six. Scoring 34 points and taking first was **Wes Krautkramer**, who moved up to 12th in the overall. Taking second with 24 points was **Jake Caughill**, who finished in the top ten (9th) in the overall. Third with 19 points was **Jeremy Jennings** who moved up from second to first overall. **Kent Williams** who scored 16.5 came out in fourth, and moved from 10th into fourth overall. **Luke Barrett** scored 13 points and took fifth place, helping him move up a place into third. **Tanner Chang** took sixth place, helping him move from 13th into fifth place in the overall.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Dakota Faircloth** (who moved from eleventh into sixth) and **Randy Harp** while equal ninths went to **Tyler McDole** and **Jayson Payne**.

MEN'S DIVISION: A little musical chairs in the overall, but most remain in the top six. With 31 points, surfing in his first CCSA this season was **Parker McMullin**. Taking second with 30 points was **Peter Kelly Jr.** also in his first CCSA this season. Scoring 29 points and taking third place was **Jachin Hamborg**,

who made the move into first place in the overall. Surfing to a fourth place finish with 23.5 was **Mikey Sacks**. Fifth place was a dead even tied with 17.5 they were **Jonathan Hehl** and **David O'Toole** who both surfed great all day long.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Matt Payne** (who finished in eighth and **Richard Payne** (who finished in second in the overall) Equal ninths went to **Paul Kahler** (who finished in fourth in the overall), **Kyle Johnson** (who took fifth overall) and **Chase Vittitoe** (who finished third overall).

WOMEN'S DIVISION: Only four contestants for the contest (Not a great turn out this year for the women. Yet there was some movement in the overall standings. Taking first with 18 points was **Krystle Melton** who remained in second place in the overall. Taking second was **Brooke Daigneault**, who cemented her hold on first place in the overall. Third went to **Breanna Kryska** who with the win took fourth in the overall, great job! Taking fourth place in the contest and sixth place in the overall, was a contest volunteer (the right place at the right time) **Lucia Westlund**. Let's see how they all do in the Invitational.

LONG BOARD DIVISION: The top six in the overall didn't change a bit, looking to show that it is a solid top six and top ten for that matter. Taking first place, as his habit is, with 32 points was **Scott Shannon**, first in the overall too! Second with 25.5 was **Tony Bartovich** first contest this season. **Patrick Schlick** scored 24.5 taking third place and stayed in second overall. **Jae Eddy** and **Pablo Fernandez** tied for fourth with 17 points. Then with a count back Jae took fourth to remain in third overall while Pablo took fifth and took fourth in the overall. **Michael Barrett** took sixth place moving him for tenth to seventh in the overall.

Other results: Equal sevenths went to **Tony Barona** (sixth in the overall) and **Dakota Faircloth**, (fifth in the overall), while equal ninths went to **Terry Carmadella** (who finished eighth in the overall) and **Josh Hessley**.

THINGS SAID IN SECRET

Some say that anonymity is the last refuge for cowards. Judging from mail and comments I've read that have been submitted anonymously, I would agree. People hiding behind the screen of anonymity or a false identity feel the freedom to launch angry, hurtful tirades. Anonymity allows them to be unkind without having to take responsibility for their words.

Whenever I am tempted to write something anonymously because I don't want to be identified with my own words, I stop and reconsider. If I don't want my name attached to it, I probably shouldn't be saying it. Then I do one of two things: I either toss it out or I rewrite it in a way that makes it helpful rather than hurtful.

According to Ephesians, our words should edify and impart grace (4:29). If I'm

unwilling to use my name, there's reason to believe that my motive is to hurt, not to help. Whenever you're tempted to say something in secret—perhaps to a family member, co-worker, or your pastor—consider why you don't want your name to be identified with your words. After all, if you don't want to be identified with your words, God probably doesn't either. He is gracious and slow to anger (Ex. 34:6), and we should be the same.
